Be Kind to One Another



In the Apostle Paul's letter to the Ephesians, he writes "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." (Ephesians 4:32) This passage from Ephesians encouraged me to think what does it truly mean to be compassionate to one another and

why is it difficult to do at times? The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines compassion as sympathetic consciousness of others' distress together with a desire to alleviate it. Exactly what does this mean though?

Theologian Henri Nouwen defined compassion best in his writing titled "Here and Now." Nouwen wrote,

"Compassion means to become close to the one who suffers. But we can come close to another person only when we are willing to become vulnerable ourselves. A compassionate person says: I am your brother, I am your sister; I am human, fragile, and mortal, just like you. I am not scandalized by your tears, nor afraid of your pain. I too have wept. I too have felt pain. We can be with the other only when the other ceases to be other and becomes like us. The suffering person calls us to become aware of our own suffering."

Nouwen's description of compassion explains why it is difficult for us at times to show compassion to others. If we are to truly show one another compassion, we must first become vulnerable and acknowledge our own pain and shortcomings. When we become vulnerable and acknowledge our own pain, it makes many of us feel uneasy and/or uncomfortable. This may be why it is difficult for many of us to show true compassion to others. Although we may be hesitant or uneasy about acknowledging our own vulnerability it can be beneficial to do so.

When we acknowledge our own vulnerability, it can help reduce our anxiety, become more self-aware, and strengthen our relationships according to *Psychology Today*. In becoming vulnerable we build stronger relationships which in return builds stronger communities. When we build stronger communities, we build a community that is resilient and that provides and cares for one another. This must have been what the Apostle Paul was encouraging when he wrote the Ephesians to "Be kind and compassionate to one another." The Apostle Paul was encouraging the Ephesians to build a strong community in Christ that cared for and provided for one another.

I believe we should follow the Apostle Paul's encouragement to show compassion to one another even if it makes us uneasy. In showing compassion for one another, I hope it will also assist with building strong relationships and a strong community that cares and provides for one another. When a community cares for one another, the community becomes a better place for all.

My siblings in Christ, I encourage us to take the Apostle Paul's words to the Ephesians to heart and to show kindness and compassion to one another. Hopefully when we show kindness and compassion to others it will build a community where all feel welcomed and cared for.

He will be responsible for visits every day at the assisted living, nursing home, and caring cottages. On April 24th, he will be covering worship at the Nursing Home for Pastor Elizabeth Goehring. He has several papers to finish by May 10th. He has been enjoying doing the children's sermons during Lent.

High School Youth Coordinator: Dorothy Grosch

They have had several requests for Egg Your yard. They are working on the Sunrise service.

Standing Committee Reports

Beer, Soup & Bible Study This study will be held in the community room at the Gateway Terrace. Potluck Supper & Game Night – Sunday, March 10th at 5pm. This went well. Not many people

attended but everyone had a great time.

Pool Party – we would like to rent the pool on either July 21st or 28th. Deb Borchers will check with Marcia Seier about who to contact.

Family Fun Night - the committee agreed to help the Evangelism Committee with this event.

Mission Endowment: All the current officers stayed the same. They reviewed the endowment accounts.

Property: The old insurance company completed their report (150pgs) on the bell tower and suggested that we submit a new claim. Part of the problem is due to a lack of maintenance. The black spots on the ceiling are caused by the change of temperatures and lack of insulation. Some of these problems need to be fixed soon. The old entry way and the audio visual balcony need a lot of work. Furnaces – we had a plan of replacing one or two a year. We need to check with Kelly's about where

- **Worship**: The Easter flowers have been ordered from Petal and Stem in Spalding. The Good Friday Ecumenical Crosswalk will take place on March 29th at 10am. They will start at the fairgrounds and end up at the new Levander funeral home. Deb Borchers volunteered to take Nancy Krohn's job of filling all of the candles with oil.



A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- · Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes

What you do:

- Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.



green symbolizes growth: growth of plant life and crops, and growth of the church in discipleship and faith.









Mobile Food Pantry Saturday, May 4th



The next Mobile Food Pantry will be held on

Saturday, May 4th at 9:00 am at the Boone County Fairgrounds. This will be set up as a drive-through only. All patrons will need to enter the fairgrounds from the 11th and Fairview entrance. Vehicles will be taken in order of arrival in a designated line. The first vehicle to arrive is asked to follow the road into the fairgrounds and stop and park directly in front of the cones that will be set out. All other vehicles entering that are there for the mobile pantry need to follow in line and wait until you have been asked to do otherwise.

If anyone is coming to volunteer their time, please park in the west parking lot next to the Casey Building. If you are willing and are able to volunteer, please arrive around 8:15 am.

If any volunteers or patrons have any symptoms of illness, please refrain from coming to the mobile pantry this month but feel free to ask someone else to pick up for you.

The Food Bank of the Heartland will provide pre-packaged boxes, along with some other produce and food products. Each patron will be required to take what is already packed in each box.

Everyone is reminded that there is always the possibility that the mobile pantry could be cancelled or postponed due to the current events. Coordinators will do their best to update the information in the newspaper or through the Boone County Nebraska Sheriff's Facebook page.


