**Approve Meeting Minutes:** Sara Rasmussen made a motion to approve the minutes of June 25, 2024. Mary Kay Tisthammer seconded. Motion carried.

## **Report of Officers**

President: Tammy Reigle – The executive committee met with sexton, Tonya Hunt, about certain things that weren't getting done. They went over the list of things that needed to be completed on a weekly, monthly and yearly basis. The job description and a new list of these expectations were given to Tonya. Bruland's gave us money in memory of Bev Bruland Rieck; the family would like to put it in the scholarship fund, with preference for a nursing student, if possible.

**Intern Pastor**: Vicar Keith Powell – He is on vacation. We have heard many good things about his time at the Nursing Home.

**High School Youth Coordinator**: Dorothy Grosch – They had a meeting with youth and parents on July 24<sup>th</sup>. Everyone was asked to consider the following categories: Worship, Service, Learning, Fun, and Fundraising. Everyone was asked to offer possible ideas for each category. These ideas were considered as the Luther League Calendar was created for the fall. This was done at the kick-off bonfire on July 31<sup>st</sup>. Luther League will have a bake sale on Rally Day, September 8<sup>th</sup>. They will trick -or-treat for the food pantry on the Wednesday before Halloween. They have offered to help folks decorate their homes for Christmas and will offer babysitting for people who need time away from the kids to go shopping for Christmas.

#### **Standing Committee Reports**

**Evangelism** – Family Fun night was fun, but not well attended due to too many things planned for the same weekend. The giveaway baskets were very nice; there was a Back-to-School basket, Candy basket, Ice Cream basket, Lottery Ticket basket, Pizza Night basket, and Taco Night basket. The movie shown was *SING*.

New member bags are being created and will contain church mugs and pens, and a

**Faith & Fellowship** – Bowling was planned for the 28<sup>th</sup>. The date was changed to July 21<sup>st</sup> at the last minute, so only nine people were able to attend. An axe throwing event for all ages has been planned at the NEST for October 20<sup>th</sup> from 3:30pm-5:30pm. The cost will be \$10 to throw the axes. The committee will provide supper for those who participate. Their next meeting is Sunday, Oct. 13<sup>th</sup> after church.

**Mission Endowment** – Treasurer Mike Webster gave a report on the different accounts.

Theresa Rengler Fund was automatically renewed at a lower percent. The committee voted to recommend to the church council that the first half of the Rengler earnings be donated to the Wrenley Frey family. Chris Nelson made a motion to approve the recommendation and donate the money (\$777.00) to the Wrenley Frey family. Roberta Seda seconded. Motion carried.

The committee has reached out to all of Zion's Jr's and Sr.'s in college and encouraged them to apply for our scholarships. Next Mission Endowment Meeting: Tuesday, October 29<sup>th</sup> at 5:30pm.

**Parish Education** – We are still looking for two Sunday School teachers. There continues to be a focus for each class: Pre-K & K: The Lords' Prayer; Grades 1&2: Apostles' Creed; Grade 3: Books of the Bible; Grades 4&5: the Fruits of the Spirit; and Grade 6: the Ten Commandments. On Rally Day there will be life-sized letters of K, N, D. The kids will stand where the "I" should be. Pictures will be taken and then posted in the space for letter I. Their next meeting is August 27<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.

Property & Maintenance – There are two new chairs in the conference room. The chairs are comfortable. There have been a few bat sightings. The bat man & Jon Porter have plans to do additional work on the roof to prevent the bats, but they are waiting for cooler weather. An external CD drive has been ordered for use at VBS and Family Fun Nights. We need to find a good place for an exhaust fan to address the ventilation issue in the kitchen; it needs to be turned off and on when the stoves are in use. The main doors on the west side were not closing all the way and M&O Doors adjusted the doors and fixed the problem.

**Women of the ELCA** – Treasurer Mary Staub gave her quarterly report. The special needs fund was closed due to inactivity; the fund is no longer used.

Worship – The outdoor service, locker mirrors, and backpack blessings were planned for August. The committee also talked about Christmas Eve worship; they are thinking about having services at 3:30pm, 5:30pm and 11:00pm. The committee put together a Time & Talent sheet insert for the bulletin on Rally Day, September 8<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Task Force Reports**

**Handicap Accessibility Project** – We received a generous donation for the phase I project. The new total due to the building fund is \$23,949.93. We still haven't heard back from the elevator people. Pastor calls quite frequently to ask for an update so we can reapply for the elevator grant. Money was also donated toward the Phase III bathroom remodel.

Love Signs Presentation/Proposal – this will be put on the annual meeting agenda.







Dating to the early 20th century, the Christian flag represents all of Christianity, though it's been used primarily in the Americas and Africa. The red Latin cross symbolizes Jesus' blood shed on Calvary to grant us eternal life. The blue background represents Christ's faithfulness even unto death, as well as our baptism into Christ. The white field signifies Jesus' purity, nonviolence and surrender to God's will, plus the peace we gain by surrendering ourselves to Christ.

# Mobile Food Pantry - Saturday, October 5<sup>th</sup>!

This month's Mobile Food Pantry will be held on Saturday, October 5<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Due to the Covid-19 virus, this will again be set up as a drive-through only. All patrons will need to enter the fairgrounds from the 11<sup>th</sup> and Fairview entrance. Vehicles will be taken in order of arrival in a designated line. The first vehicle to arrive is asked to follow the road into the fairgrounds and stop and park directly in front of the cones that will be set out. All other vehicles entering that are there for the mobile pantry need to follow in line and wait until you have been asked to do otherwise.

If anyone is coming to volunteer their time, please park in the west parking lot next to the Casey Building. If you are willing and are able to volunteer, please arrive around 8:15 am.

If any volunteers or patrons have any symptoms of illness, please refrain from coming to the mobile pantry this month but feel free to ask someone else to pick up for you.

The Food Bank of the Heartland will provide pre-packaged boxes, along with some other produce and food products. Each patron will be required to take what is already packed in each box.

A specific number of vehicles at a time will be sent down to the distribution area. All people attending must remain in their vehicles unless asked to get out. All cars in the distribution area must remain parked until all of those vehicles are told to move. This is a big change as to how things are generally done so we ask for your patience and cooperation as the volunteers are doing their best.

Everyone is reminded that there is always the possibility that the mobile pantry could be cancelled or postponed due to the current events. Coordinators will do their best to update the information in the newspaper or through the Boone County Nebraska Sheriff's Facebook page.





# LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF OFFERING OCTOBER 13, 2024

Making LWR Mission Quilts provides an opportunity for Lutherans in the U.S. to answer God's call to love and serve our neighbors in need. To those that receive them, they are tangible symbols of God's love and compassion. A continued generous response from congregations in Nebraska will ensure that LWR is able to respond to the increasing needs overseas.

Each year LWR spends nearly \$1.9 million to operate its Quilt and Kit Ministry. Those funds, combined with the generosity of quilters and kit-makers throughout the United States, enable LWR to distribute more than \$18 million worth of guilts and kits annually.





Below is the approximate cost to deliver Quilts & Kits:

Mission Quilt \$2.80 School Kit \$2.85 Personal Care Kit \$1.50

\$100 would help send: 10 guilts or 20 school kits or 10 health kits. For a little more than the spare change you might have in your pocket, you can help with the cost of shipping.

The kits and guilts are an all-congregation event as the fabric and supplies are donated by all of you. Please place your monetary gift in the envelope you will find in this Messenger and bring to worship on October 15<sup>th</sup>.






Bible Quiz Answer: C (See John 4:6)



Cynthia Sue (Haas) Kraus was born October 25, 1942, to Luther and Ruby Haas.

She was born in their apartment that was located where Pump and Pantry currently resides in Albion, NE. A year and one week later she welcomed her younger sister Betty Lou into the family.

Cynthia grew up in Albion attending Albion Public Schools. Cynthia and Betty would walk to school every day together. Cynthia graduated from Albion High School with the class of 1960. After graduation she attended one

year of college at the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks. Cynthia decided to attend college at the University of North Dakota because her favorite music teacher went there to teach, and she wanted to continue to learn from him. After a year, she decided college was not for her and followed the love of her life, Frank Kraus, to California. While Frank was stationed in Long Beach, CA; Cynthia resided in Santa Monica, CA, with Albion classmates. On May 12, 1962, Cynthia and Frank were married in Santa Monica, CA, in front of a small crowd of just seven witnesses, which included the Priest. Frank was discharged from the Navy in September of 1962, and the couple moved back to Nebraska to be closer to family. It was during their drive back to Nebraska in the Colorado mountains, where Frank first fell in love with the mountains and made the comment that that would be their future destination for vacations.

Cynthia and Frank first moved to Columbus, NE, and then to Bassett, NE, before finally returning to Albion in 1965. While residing in Bassett, Cynthia and Frank welcomed their son, Trent Michael, to their family in 1963. Trent has blessed Cynthia with five grandchildren.

Prior to serving as secretary here at Zion Lutheran Church, Cynthia served the community of Albion in many roles. While in high school, she worked summers with the county court clerk. Cynthia also worked as a bookkeeper for her parents' business Albion Tire and Auto Supply and her son's business known as NAPA Auto Parts. She also worked as a server at Albion Country Club and at Casey's. Cynthia eventually returned to work at the Boone County courthouse working in the county assessor's office and in the treasurer's office during tax season. She also worked for County Clerk, Kathy Thorberg, preparing vendors each month and helping out at election times.

In her spare time Cynthia likes to spend her time knitting and crocheting and studying genealogy. She also finds joy in attending her weekly coffee group at The Dotted Daisy and visiting with others. She used to attend shows at the Lied Center for Performing Arts in Lincoln. Cynthia also used to enjoy traveling, especially with her husband Frank. Their favorite place to go was to Colorado, especially the Estes Park area. Estes Park became their favorite place to travel due to the fact Frank had never traveled by car, and he fell in love with the area. Estes Park became the place where they would spend a few days of relaxation for many of their forty years of marriage. Frank passed away the morning of December 29, 2002, after a year-long battle with cancer. Cynthia played the piano and the organ for St. Michael's Church, the Methodist Church for Sunday services and for funerals, including Zion Lutheran Church.

Cynthia was baptized on March 21, 1943, and raised in the Lutheran faith here at Zion Lutheran Church. She was confirmed at Zion Lutheran Church on March 25, 1956. Cynthia joined the Catholic church after her marriage to Frank. In 2013, she decided to return home to Zion Lutheran Church. Besides serving as one of the church secretaries, she is also a member of WELCA and Grace Circle. We are thankful for all the ways in which Cynthia has chosen to serve God at Zion. She continues to be a blessing to all of us.

At this time of year, many Christians wonder if they should take part in Halloween activities.




The Christian history of Halloween
