2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly

The 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly will be held July 28 – Aug. 2, 2025, at the Phoenix Convention Center in Phoenix, Arizona.

The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, is a process of communal spiritual discernment. When the ELCA Churchwide Assembly convenes, its voting members meet with confidence in God's grace around word and water, wine and bread, to carry on their work on behalf of the entire church. Over the course of the assembly, voting members:

- + Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units.
- Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies.
- ♣ Elect officers, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws.
- → Establish ELCA churchwide policy.
- → Worship together.
- Adopt a budget.
- ♣ Conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.

For the Life of the World

The first Council of Nicaea was convened 1,700 years ago, beginning the process of setting forth Christian convictions in what we know today as the Nicene Creed. The creed proclaims the life-giving truth of the triune

God and our steadfast faith in Jesus Christ "for ... the life of the world to come." These convictions continue to live and breathe among us in word and sacrament.

Early in her tenure, Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton set forth her own convictions to guide the members of the ELCA in understanding our unique identity, and these convictions have become a recognized way of articulating who we are:

- → We are church.
- ⊕ We are Lutheran.
- We are church together.
- We are church for the sake of the world.

We are church for the sake of the world — for the abundant life promised by God and fulfilled in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for all creation.

We recognize the wisdom of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who said, "The church is the church only when it exists for others." Our constitution's "Statement of Purpose" boldly proclaims this commitment to be a people "called and sent to bear witness to God's creative, redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the world."

Rooted in the ancient creeds, we are called to live boldly in service to a world longing for healing, justice and hope. We will continue to faithfully pursue God's mission of reconciliation for the life of the world.

When You Don't Feel Like It

We all struggle with spiritual discouragement and lethargy. Some days our circumstances threaten to overwhelm us, and we struggle just to pray. Many times, we just don't feel like doing the things we know we should. For one reason or another, God sometimes seems far off and unreachable.

David faced times like these in his life. The Psalms are filled with verses that express his despair and feeling of abandonment.

Yet the Psalms also give us the key to living victoriously during the dark periods of life. Let's take a quick look at Psalm 119:89-95*.

"Forever, O LORD, Your word is settled in heaven.

Your faithfulness continues throughout all generations; You established the earth, and it stands.

They stand this day according to Your ordinances..."

My circumstances or feelings have not changed God. He is the same God today as He was when He hung the stars in the sky, led the Israelites through the Red Sea, and fed the five thousand.

"For all things are Your servants..."

All things, even the things affecting me right now, are God's servants. The circumstance, people, and events around me are all under God. They are His servants, designed to help and bless me spiritually.

"If Your law had not been my delight, then I would have perished in my affliction." I will never forget Your precepts, for by them You have revived me. I am Yours, save me; for I have sought Your precepts.

The wicked wait for me to destroy me; I shall diligently consider Your testimonies."

Recalling God's faithfulness and control over everything that touches us gives us strength to walk with God even when we feel like giving up in despair. After all, our feelings and circumstances have not changed God. He is perfectly capable of sustaining us if we will only let Him. We simply need to choose to delight in and diligently consider God's precepts (His principles and character) despite how we feel. Choosing to delight in God might not be easy. It might even involve hard work. But only God can revive and save our soul from spiritual lethargy.

Next time you feel spiritually drained or inadequate, remember that you have a choice. You can wrap yourself up in excuses and self-pity, or you can choose to draw your strength from an unchanging God.

Ephesus

Ephesus is this month's highlighted city from my trip that followed the Apostle Paul's journeys. It is an ancient coastal city located in present day Selcuk in the Izmir Province of Turkey. Ephesus was a recipient city of one of the

Pauline epistles, also known as one of the Letters of Paul. It is also one of the seven churches of Asia which are addressed in the Book of Revelation. While in Izmir we had the opportunity to tour the ancient city of Ephesus along with the ruins of The Basilica of St. John, where John the Apostle is said to be buried. The House of the Virgin Mary was another stop in this region. The legend is that Mary, the mother of Jesus, may have spent the last years of her life in Ephesus.

The Apostle's time in Ephesus is recorded in Acts 19. Paul arrived in Ephesus and found a group of disciples who had been baptized in the name of John the Baptist. Paul then baptized the disciples, and they received the Holy Spirit and were able to speak in tongues and prophesy. Paul then went into the synagogue and spoke boldly about the kingdom of God for three months. When some synagogue leaders opposed him, Paul left the synagogue and began teaching in the Hall of Tyrannus for two years, continuing to spread the message of Christ throughout Asia.

God performed miracles through Paul during his time in Ephesus. People were healed by touching items that Paul has used, such as handkerchiefs or aprons. This was a demonstration of the power of the Holy Spirit working through Paul. Many who practiced magic and sorcery repented and even burned their magical scrolls to symbolize their conversion to Christianity. The word of the Lord spread and gained power which led to a great number of conversions in Ephesus and the surrounding area. The growing influence of Christianity certainly caused a disturbance in Ephesus when many people turned away from their idol worship. Demetrius, a silversmith who made shrines of Artemis, led a riot accusing Paul of causing economic harm. A huge crowd gathered, shouting, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!" The city clerk eventually calmed the crowd, reminding them of the legal repercussions of their actions and dismissed the riot. When the uproar ended, Paul sent for the disciples and, after encouraging them, he said goodbye and set out for Macedonia.

The city of Izmir and the sites of Ephesus, such as the House of the Virgin Mary and the Basilica of St. John were wonderful to see and experience. The city is full of history and many wonderful sites to see. I wish we had had more time to tour the city and were able to go into the theater in Ephesus where the riots took place. We were unable to do this however, because it was under restoration at the time of our visit. Overall, the time in Izmir was wonderful.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 5:55pm by Tammy Reigle.

Equipping Time: Kay Flanagan sent a music video and a discussion question for us to watch and reflect upon. It was the song, *Your Ways Better* by Forrest Frank. We talked about God's timing versus our timing.

Approve Minutes: Jim Meyer made a motion to approve the minutes of May 20, 2025. Roberta Seda seconded. Motion carried.

Report of Officers

President: Tammy Reigle – Tammy ordered the cake for the recognition of Carroll Rolf this Sunday, June 29th. Roberta Seda offered to possibly help pick up the cake on Saturday. Pastor shared the gifts we will be giving Carroll which are a t-shirt (Mr. Mow-it-all), Mowing socks, keychain, and a Christmas ornament (Always Kicking Grass!).

Vice President: Mary Kay Tisthammer – Mary Kay has agreed to serve as the chairperson for the fundraising committee. They will meet for the first time on Sunday, July 20th, after church. They will generate ideas as well as a visual for our fundraising goals.

Treasurer: Nancy Ahlers - Due to some larger bills and the low attendance in the summer, the checking account is tight on funds. Nancy would like to transfer \$10,000 from the Dankert account into the checking account as a balance buffer. The council agreed to the transfer by consensus. Sara Rasmussen made a motion to accept the April Treasurer's Report. Jim Meyer seconded. Motion carried.

Staff Reports

Senior Pastor: Rev. Carolann Hopcke – Ann Tisthammer contacted Pastor about donating her parents' antique organ to Zion. The council decided to accept the donation; it will be placed in the lounge. Confirmation Camp went well – we had 6 youth participate this year. Thanks to Vicar Keith for taking all the pictures and posting them for everyone on Facebook. The Boone County Fair worship will be held on Sunday, July 13th, with Vicar Keith preaching. Pastor's brother will be visiting during Fair so she will be taking some days off that she didn't get in May & June. Pastor donated a Snow Cone machine to Zion for VBS and other activities. She contacted the Albion Arts Council and received permission to offer snow cones for a freewill donation during the Summer Concert series in July. Pastor will make a sign-up sheet for the bulletin board as well as on signup genius. We think we need 2-3 volunteers per week to do this.

Intern Pastor: Vicar Keith Powell – Confirmation Camp was fun & exhausting! A middle school retreat at camp is planned for October 17-19; Vicar is hoping to take some of our youth to this event. Vicar has vacation scheduled for August 6-12 & 28-31. He will be attending the Nebraska Synod Candidacy Retreat August 22-23. Prolog at Wartburg this semester is scheduled for September 1-5.

High School Youth Coordinator: Dorothy Grosch – The ELCA Youth Ministry Network offers a resource known as Martin's List that Dorothy would like to access. The cost is \$95 per year for her, or \$45 for students. Vicar Keith is a student and can access this resource for us.

Faith and Fellowship: The trip to Harrah's Casino and Racetrack in Columbus for June 22nd was cancelled due to weather and low availability. It will be rescheduled. Their next meeting is Sunday, July 27th.

Property & Maintenance:

Bell Tower: Tommy Heesacker completed work on Friday, June 20th. The final cost is \$13,581. We have \$10,000 from Insurance + \$2,070 from the \$40 for Lent envelopes. The remaining balance of \$1,511 will be paid from the Building Fund, which has a balance of \$113,030.13.

Parsonage Fence: A loose board was repaired by Bob Bruland & Pat Zaruba.

Oreck Vacuum: Jenny Gompert likes the vacuum and thinks it works well. We will purchase 2 more so that there is a vacuum on each level of the church.

Worship: The outdoor worship service with a pet blessing is scheduled for Sunday, August 10th. The wedding Pastor did in Genoa went well, except for two of the groomsmen, who were very disrespectful during the ceremony.

Task Force Reports:

Handicap Accessibility Project:

We have received the Leon and Lorna Krab Kraft Memorial Grant for \$30,000! Work needs to begin by June 2026 and be completed by June 2027. We will receive ½ of the money at the start of the construction & the remainder when the final bill for the project is rendered. Tammy Reigle signed the grant acceptance contract which is due by July 31st.

This central furnishing in a Christian worship space is usually large,



with a solid front that may be decorated with symbols or words. The flat surface, often covered with a cloth, is where the Communion elements are prepared and placed, reminding us of Jesus' sacrifice as the Lamb of God. In some churches, the altar looks more like a table, with open legwork. We remember that Jesus invites us into fellowship with God now and to the heavenly banquet for eternity. We place offerings on the altar to symbolize our sacrificial response to God's redeeming love.



Mobile Food Pantry ~ Saturday, August 2nd

The next Mobile Food Pantry will be held on Saturday, August 2nd, at 9:00 am at the Boone County Fairgrounds. This is set up as a drive-through only. All patrons will need to enter the fairgrounds from the 11th and Fairview entrance. Vehicles will be taken in order of arrival in a designated line. FYI: There are new forms to be completed. The first vehicle to arrive is asked to follow the road into the fairgrounds and stop and park directly in front of the cones that will be set out. All other vehicles entering that are there for the mobile pantry need to follow in line and wait until you have been asked to do otherwise.

If anyone is coming to volunteer their time, please park in the west parking lot next to the Casey Building. If you are willing and are able to volunteer, please arrive around 8:15 am.

If any volunteers or patrons have any symptoms of illness, please refrain from coming to the mobile pantry this month. Patrons may ask someone else to pick up for them; there are now Proxy Consent Forms for this purpose.

The Food Bank of the Heartland will provide pre-packaged boxes, along with some other produce and food products. Each patron will be required to take what is already packed in each box.

A specific number of vehicles at a time will be sent down to the distribution area. All people attending must remain in their vehicles unless asked to get out. All cars in the distribution area must remain parked until all of those vehicles are told to move. We continue to ask for your patience and cooperation as the volunteers are doing their best.

Everyone is reminded that there is always the possibility that the mobile pantry could be cancelled or postponed due to the current events. Coordinators will do their best to update the information in the newspaper or through the Boone County Nebraska Sheriff's Facebook page.


What you need:


EOPLE SPOTS




