This letter reminds us that Jesus is no longer only in Bethlehem but is present everywhere, including each of our hearts. To find Jesus, we need only look beyond the materialism of the season — past the stores, gifts, and decorations, to the real reason for the season.

The reason for the season is the coming of Christ into the world to save us. Jesus became one of us so that we might know him in body and spirit.

This poem also suggests that we take a moment from the hustle and bustle of the holiday season to simply listen to our own heart, knowing that that is where Jesus lives. Christ is found in the quiet moments, when He is "whispering our name."

In this season of waiting for Christ's coming, we are called to prepare ourselves — to prepare our hearts, minds, and lives. We can do that by spending time in prayer, reading scripture, and performing acts of love in the name of Jesus.

Reading Scripture will remind us of God's story of love and salvation, which is the reason he came.

Prayer is a way of keeping us close to God. We have the privilege and freedom to speak with God at all time and in all circumstances.

Some possible acts of love may include visiting the lonely, writing to soldiers, or spending time with loved ones instead of buying excessive gifts.

May we take the time in this Advent season to truly prepare for Christ's return.

#### The Twelve Day of Christmas

The story is told that from 1558 until 1829 people in England were not allowed to practice their faith openly. During this era, the song 'The Twelve Days of Christmas' was written as a subtle way of celebrating Christ's birth in public without risk of prosecution. The song's lyrics had a hidden meaning known only to members of the church, each element of the twelve days offering code meaning for a religious reality.

- The partridge in a pear tree stood for Jesus Christ
- The two turtledoves stood for the Old and New Testaments
- Three French hens stood for faith, hope, and charity.
- The four calling birds were the four gospels
- The five gold rings represented the first five books of the Old Testament (the Law).
- The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation
- Seven swans a-swimming signified the sevenfold gifts of the Spirit.
- The eight maids a-milking represented the beatitudes.
- The Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Spirit. (See the fifth chapter of Galatians.)
- 10. Ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.
- 11. Eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- 12. Twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles Creed.

I thought this was very interesting and honestly made me realize how truly blessed we are now that we can openly worship and praise Jesus without worrying about being harmed or jailed for our beliefs. I know I take the freedoms we have today for granted.



**Equipping Time**: Sara Rasmussen asked us some fun questions for us to get to know each other a little better.

**Approve Minutes**: Roberta Seda made a motion to approve the minutes of September 16, 2025. Sara Rasmussen seconded. **Motion carried.** 

#### **Report of Officers**

**President**: Tammy Reigle – No Report

**Vice President**: Mary Kay Tisthammer – No Report

Treasurer: Nancy Ahlers – Mary Kay Tisthammer made a motion to authorize Nancy Ahlers to choose Portico's Select Copay 2000 for Pastor's health insurance. This is the most comparable to the Gold+ plan that she's had since she started at Zion. (This may be for nought because Pastor turned 65 and has signed up for Medicare.) Roberta Seda seconded. Motion carried. Josh Thayer made a motion to set the fair rental for housing for the parsonage at \$7200. Jim Meyer seconded. Motion carried. Amanda Reinhart made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Jim Meyer seconded it. Motion carried.

#### **Staff Reports**

Senior Pastor: Rev. Carolann Hopcke – Rev. Hillary Christensen will supply for Holy Communion on Nov. 23 and 30<sup>th</sup>, while pastor is on vacation. Pastor needs a Thrivent card for the light parade giveaways. The Immanuel Vision Foundation \$2,000 grant for hospital bears and dogs was approved and received. Kay Flanagan has resigned from doing PowerPoint. She is still willing to create the schedules and fill-in as available. Folks who have expressed an interest to join Zion: the Henn and Temme families. Marlys Smith would like to be an associate member. Letters for All Saints Sunday have been mailed. Reminder about the "Friendship Books" – these books replace the communion cards that we used to collect. Every one needs to participate – if you're already a member, simply write your name & check the member box.

Intern Pastor: Vicar Keith Powell – The synod Middle School Retreat was cancelled. A synod lock-in is March 6 & 7, 2026. The youth gathering in 2027 is in Minneapolis. An average of six people are attending the Sunday morning Bible Study. Confirmation is going well. Vicar will be gone for Veteran's Sunday due to a rural ministry class in Illinois. The next internship committee meeting will be Monday, November 17<sup>th</sup>.

**High School Youth Coordinator**: Dorothy Grosch – Vicar Keith & Melissa Kettelson took Luther League to the Holy Family Shrine in Gretna followed by a trip to Roca Berry Farm on Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup>. Dorothy was sick & couldn't attend.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Faith and Fellowship**: The gathering at the Nest scheduled for October 12<sup>th</sup> was cancelled due to lack of availability. This will be rescheduled in 2026. The committee is planning another Holiday Dinner at the Albion Country Club in December.

**Finance:** The committee is working on the budget for 2026. It will be ready to present to council in November.

**Mission Endowment**: The committee is asking for council approval to move the Randall & Donna Kruse Scholarship Bond Fund to an ELCA Growth Fund when the bond comes due on November 6, 2025. Jim Meyer made a motion to move the Randall & Donna Kruse Bond Fund to an ELCA Growth Fund when it comes due. Sara Rasmussen seconded. **Motion carried**.

Calvin Webster has applied for the Harry Kruse Scholarship. Mission Endowment is recommending \$1,000 be given to Calvin Webster. Mary Kay Tisthammer made a motion to award \$1,000 to Calvin Webster from the Harry Kruse Scholarship Fund. Josh Thayer seconded. **Morton carried**. Overall, the committee reports that our funds have done well in 2025.

Fundraising Committee: The Elevator fund chart is next to the elevator in the upper narthex. (It was too tall for the lower narthex.) Elevator Pledge Drive monies have been coming in during the month of October. The silent auction bids were just over \$5,000. The front door collected \$1,800. The chili and cinnamon rolls were very good! Chili Winners: #1 Seth Flanagan, #2 Jolene Roberg. Cinnamon Roll Winners: #1 Jessica Reestman, #2 Jacque Dickey. The committee purchased skinny tables for the silent auction. Jim Meyer made a motion to pay for the tables with Memorial Fund money. Roberta Seda seconded. Motion carried.

**Parish Education:** There are some new members in Sunday School. The committee would like a way to keep track of new registrations every year. Rice Bowl banks were given to Sunday School students. The banks are due back on December 14<sup>th</sup>. The money collected helps to feed kids in orphanages across the world. Background checks are renewed every three years which means that most of the teachers need theirs renewed. The last three pieces of the Nativity scene (the Wise Men) will be painted on November 16<sup>th</sup>. Lisa Thayer is writing the *ABC's of Christmas* as the Sunday School Christmas program for December 14<sup>th</sup>. The Christmas ornaments that will be given to the children at the Christmas program are nativity cross ornaments.

Property & Maintenance: Door Keepers: Gay Sandman will continue to lock on weekday evenings unless there are meetings. The counters will unlock on Monday mornings. Cheryl Sherburne will unlock on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings. Rolan and Connie Bentjen will unlock & lock on the weekends. Jon Porter plugged the hole in the furnace room where bats might have gotten in. Sara Rasmussen replaced the pulpit light. Scaffolding is needed to replace sanctuary light bulbs. Sara Rasmussen said we can use Tracy Coakes' scaffolding. We talked about snow removal. We are unsure of who removed the snow the last two years. Tammy Reigle shared information from Applied Connective about how much it would cost to have the doors lock automatically, which is @ \$4,500. Cindy Rasmussen found someone from York who can come to Albion and clean grandfather clocks, so Pastor put us on the list to clean the church clock. Zion's grandfather clock has not been cleaned since Russell Nore died.

**Worship Committee**: Veteran's Day worship is November 9<sup>th</sup> with a brunch to follow. The church pianos will be tuned on Thursday, December 4<sup>th</sup>. There will only be two Christmas Eve Services: 3:30pm & 5:30pm. Jane Mundschenk & Nicole Levander have volunteered to fill the candles.

#### Task Force Reports

**Handicap Accessibility Project**: Elevator Fund = \$183,854.75 (+ \$30,000 Grant) as of September 30, 2025. Josh Thayer talked to Fire Inspector, Todd Brehm, and has invited him to visit our building and meet with us. We are awaiting a date based on his availability.

**New Business**: Amanda Reinhart made a motion to schedule the congregational meeting for after worship on Sunday, February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Mary Kay Tisthammer seconded. **Motion carried**.

Next Meeting: Tuesday, November 18, 2025, at 6pm. Mary Kay Tisthammer has equipping time.

**Adjournment**: Mary Kay Tisthammer made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:35pm. Roberta Seda seconded. **Motion carried.** The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

#### Mobile Food Pantry ~ Sat., December 6<sup>th</sup>!

The next Mobile Food Pantry will be held on Saturday, December 6<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am at the Boone County Fairgrounds. Due to the Covid-19 virus, this will again be set up as a drive-through only. All patrons will need to enter the fairgrounds from the 11<sup>th</sup> and Fairview entrance. Vehicles will be taken in order of arrival in a designated line. The first vehicle to arrive is asked to follow the road into the fairgrounds and stop and park directly in front of the cones that will be set out. All other vehicles entering that are there for the mobile pantry need to follow in line and wait until you have been asked to do otherwise.

If anyone is coming to volunteer their time, please park in the west parking lot next to the Casey Building. If you are willing and are able to volunteer, please arrive around 8:15 am.

If any volunteers or patrons have any symptoms of illness, please refrain from coming to the mobile pantry this month but feel free to ask someone else to pick up for you.

The Food Bank of the Heartland will provide pre-packaged boxes, along with some other produce and food products. Each patron will be required to take what is already packed in each box.

A specific number of vehicles at a time will be sent down to the distribution area. All people attending must remain in their vehicles unless asked to get out. All cars in the distribution area must remain parked until all of those vehicles are told to move. This is a big change as to how things are generally done so we ask for your patience and cooperation as the volunteers are doing their best.

Everyone is reminded that there is always the possibility that the mobile pantry could be cancelled or postponed due to the current events. Coordinators will do their best to update the information in the newspaper or through the Boone County Nebraska Sheriff's Facebook page.


#### **POINSETTIAS**

This shrub, native to Mexico, is at the heart of legend about a poor girl who wanted to bring Baby Jesus a gift one Christmas Eve. As she walked to church, she gathered a bouquet of weeds — which Jesus miraculously transformed into lovely red flowers. Thus the poinsettia (named for Joel Poinsett, the U.S. ambassador to Mexico who first brought the plant to America) is known in Mexico as la flor de la Nochebuena (flower of the Holy Night). The poinsettia is also an ideal Christmas symbol because its leaves turn red when deprived of sunlight and its flowers (the red inner buds) bloom in December.

All Saints' Day is a time to remember all the saints who have faithfully lived and died with the Lord.








### Zion Lutheran Church 2026 Serving Groups


