Sarah was seven when she met Evelyn for the first time, who easily had a 75 year head start on life. Sarah, the oldest of three, was given the "big job" of watching her younger brother and sister as together they occupied the last pew of the church during the 5pm Saturday Worship Service. They always sat in that last pew because it was the closest one to the doors where her parents were stationed in their weekly role as "greeters".

Sarah thought Evelyn looked lonely sitting all by herself in the pew, so at the end of worship she leaned over and offered her one of the pictures she had drawn, along with a smile and a short seven-year old introduction, causing Evelyn to smile too, a first for her that day. The following week Evelyn showed up in the pew next to Sarah again and the picture exchange was repeated, this time before worship started, along with a few more back and forth exchanges. The next several weeks turned into months and the months into five years as Sarah, then twelve, and Evelyn exchanged many more stories than pictures on Saturdays at 5pm. Evelyn wanted to know how Sarah was doing in school? Did she make the play? Where did she go on vacation? Did she work out the problem with her neighbor friend? Their weekly reunions in the last pew in the back had become a highlight for both.

Later that year, Evelyn began missing worship, and after the third week in a row, Sarah grew worried. During the reading of the prayers, Sarah heard Evelyn's name read aloud under the list of those who had passed away that week. She turned to her parents, tears already on her cheeks and cried, "I have to go to her funeral!" Sarah's mom held onto Sarah and tried to comfort her. She said that the funeral would most likely be during school, but Sarah didn't care,

she had to say goodbye to her 5pm Saturday friend.

The wake was held later that week at the church. As Sarah walked toward the casket that held Evelyn, she was encircled by a group of strangers who were all staring at her. "I bet you're Sarah," one of the women said with tears forming in her eyes. "Yes I am," Sarah replied with surprise, "how did you know?" "Oh, we know all about you!" a man said who was standing next to the woman. "Evelyn was our Mother, and you were her favorite reason to come to church."

As he said this, his sister held up a stack of slightly wrinkled color drawings. "Up until yesterday these decorated our Mother's refrigerator for the past five years. Some weeks she wasn't really up to going to church, but she would insist saying, 'I have to see my friend Sarah!' You were a Godsend to her and we had hoped you would come today so we could finally meet you in person and thank you for making her feel so welcomed at church."

Sarah shared her story on a youth retreat as a senior in high school, explaining why she chose to become a greeter at the age of thirteen, and how she now finds herself standing alongside her parents behind the last pew in church as they welcome those coming to the Saturday 5pm Worship.

Worship matters. Church relationships matter. May we always reach out to one another with God's love as the circle of our church family continues to grow.

From the Vicar

This month: Thessaloniki

The city I will be sharing about from my trip following the Apostle Paul is the city of Thessaloniki. Thessaloniki is the second-largest city in Greece. It is located in northern Greece at the northwest corner of the Aegean Sea. The city is named after the daughter of Phillip II and sister of Alexander the Great, Thessalonike.

At the time of the Roman Empire, about 50 A.D., Thessaloniki was one of the early centers of Christianity; while the Apostle Paul was on his second missionary journey, he visited this city's chief synagogue on three Sabbaths and planted the seeds for Thessaloniki's first Christian church. Later, Paul wrote letters to the new church in Thessaloniki; these letters appear in the bible as First and Second Thessalonians.

Apostle Paul's visit to Thessaloniki is read about in Acts 17:1-19. In Acts 17, Paul and his companions traveled through Amphipolis and Apollonia before arriving in Thessalonica (Thessaloniki), where they preached in a Jewish synagogue for three Sabbaths. It is not clear if Paul preached for three consecutive Sabbaths or if the preaching was spread over a longer period than three weeks. Paul explained from the Scriptures that the Messiah had to suffer and rise from the dead, declaring that Jesus was the Messiah. Some members of the synagogue, were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas.

However, other members became jealous, inciting a mob by recruiting troublemakers. They searched for Paul and Silas at Jason's house but could not find them, so they dragged Jason and some other believers to the city officials, accusing them of defying Caesar and proclaiming Jesus as another king. The city was thrown into chaos, and Jason and the others were forced to post bail before being released. As soon as night fell, the believers sent Paul and Silas away to Berea.

While in Thessaloniki we visited the Church of Saint Demetrius, also known as Hagios Demetrios. The Church of Saint Demetrius is the main sanctuary dedicated to Saint Demetrius, the patron saint of Thessaloniki. Saint Demetrius was a Greek Christian martyr of the early fourth century AD. Underneath the Church of Saint Demetrius is an old bathhouse

where Saint Demetirus was imprisoned and eventually martyred, along with other Christians of the early Roman period. We were unable to go down to the old bathhouse due to arriving too late in the evening.

The city of Thessaloniki was a wonderful city to experience. The city is full of history and many wonderful sites to see. I wish we would have had more time to tour the city of Thessaloniki.

Luther League met with Pastor on February 26th to plan our annual Easter Sunrise Service. The Ash Wednesday Soup Supper was a success! They served over 40 people and received \$605 in free will donations. The Egg Your Yard fundraiser will be on Saturday, April 19th.

Committee Reports:

Parish Education:

Sunday School: Pretzel Sunday was a success! Folks really enjoyed the Lenten Lutheran Rosary project.

Confirmation: scheduled for May 4th. The Affirmation Dinner will be on Friday, May 2nd. Nicole Levander agreed to coordinate this supper.

Lenten Bible Challenge: The students seem excited about this challenge. They are looking for a Lego Bible & Kit to be the end of the challenge prize.

First Communion: There are four students this year. They will receive the First Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday, April 17th during worship. There was an informational meeting on March 9th, with the first class on Tuesday, March 11th at Jerene Kruse's to make their pottery chalices & patens.

Property & Maintenance:

Bell Tower: Josh Thayer talked with Tommy Heesacker about the Bell Tower. Tommy came and looked at the bell tower with a work associate. They came up with a plan to fix the leaks in the Bell Tower and will submit an estimate soon.

Task Force Reports:

Handicap Accessibility Project: Pastor spoke with someone from the Kraft Grant for the elevator. They are able to grant \$50,000 per grant cycle (twice a year). If more than one deserving recipient applies, money will be shared. If no one applies the money can roll over to the next cycle. The application deadline for this cycle is April 23rd. Nicki Heidemann is working on writing the application for this grant but is waiting for information from the elevator architect. Josh Thayer told the architect that we needed the information by April 1st. Roberta Seda also found some grants for which we may be eligible.

Old Business:

There are still openings for leading the equipping time. Someone is needed for the April meeting!

New Business:

Doris Warner would like all undesignated memorial money for her son, Greg, to be given to the Zion Memorial Scholarship Fund. The deadline for scholarships was March 14, 2025.



Make these sweet sandwiches for a Mother's Day tea party.

- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced




Communion Elements Available



Mobile Food Pantry Saturday, May 3rd

The next Mobile Food Pantry will be held on Saturday, May 3rd at 9:00 am at the Boone County Fairgrounds. This will be set up as a drive-through only. All patrons will need to enter the fairgrounds from the 11th and Fairview entrance. Vehicles will be taken in order of arrival in a designated line. The first vehicle to arrive is asked to follow the road into the fairgrounds and stop and park directly in front of the cones that will be set out. All other vehicles entering that are there for the mobile pantry need to follow in line and wait until you have been asked to do otherwise.

If anyone is coming to volunteer their time, please park in the west parking lot next to the Casey Building. If you are willing and are able to volunteer, please arrive around 8:15 am.

If any volunteers or patrons have any symptoms of illness, please refrain from coming to the mobile pantry this month but feel free to ask someone else to pick up for you.

The Food Bank of the Heartland will provide pre-packaged boxes, along with some other produce and food products. Each patron will be required to take what is already packed in each box.

Everyone is reminded that there is always the possibility that the mobile pantry could be cancelled or postponed due to the current events. Coordinators will do their best to update the information in the newspaper or through the Boone County Nebraska Sheriff's Facebook page.

Happy **Mother's** Day Sunday, May 11th!

We remember

More than 150 years ago, Memorial Day took shape amid the backdrop of the U.S. Civil War. Before it ended, women began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1868, when May 30 was designated as Decoration Day, loved ones placed flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers alike.

By 1882, Decoration Day became known as Memorial Day, and soldiers who died in other wars were honored, too. Over time, it became a day to remember all loved ones who have died — in war and otherwise. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed on the last Monday in May. On Memorial Day, we pause to remember people who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and for our freedom. We also pray for those who continue serving, especially those in harm's way.






PEOPLE SPOTS


