

Steve acknowledged her and continued to talk to Denny for several more minutes about summer, bicycles and school. Steve watched his brown

eyes dance with excitement, because he was the center of someone's attention. He then abruptly turned and headed toward the toy section.

Denny's mom had a puzzled look on her face and thanked Steve for taking the time to talk with her son. She said that most people won't even look at him, much less talk to him.

Steve told her that it was his pleasure and then said something he had no idea where it came from, other than by the prompting of the Holy Spirit. He told her that there are plenty of red, yellow, and pink roses in God's Garden; however, "Blue Roses" are very rare and should be appreciated for their beauty and distinctiveness. You see, Denny is a Blue Rose and if someone doesn't stop and smell that rose with their heart and touch that rose with their kindness, then they've missed a blessing from God.

She was silent for a second, then with a tear in her eye she asked, "Who are you?"

Without thinking Steve said, "Oh, I'm probably just a dandelion, but I sure love living in God's garden."

She reached out, squeezed Steve's hand and said, "God bless you!" Then Steve had tears in his eyes.




## RULES OF LIFE

# From the Vicar



<sup>28</sup>One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" <sup>29</sup>Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; <sup>30</sup>you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' <sup>31</sup>The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' *here is no other commandment greater than these.*"  
(Mark 12:28-31)

In this passage from Mark, Jesus is asked to name the greatest commandment. Jesus answered: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart...and love your neighbor as yourself." Most often we are great at remembering the part about loving God and loving others, but so often the final phrase, the part that says as yourself, is forgotten. Yet the word yourself is an essential part. Healthy love for others begins with a healthy understanding of our own worth in God's eyes.

Loving yourself is not selfish, as often we are led to believe. Loving oneself is recognizing that you are also a beloved creation of God. Accepting God's love for us fully and honestly, is an act of faith.

Many of us are quick to offer grace to others while withholding it from ourselves. We forgive neighbors, encourage friends, and show compassion to strangers, yet we remain harsh and critical toward our own actions and hearts. Jesus does not ask us to love our neighbor instead of ourselves. He asks us to love as ourselves. This implies a sense of balance; just as we would offer patience, kindness, and mercy to someone else, we are called to extend the same to ourselves.

When we learn to love ourselves in a God-centered way, our love for others becomes more genuine and sustainable. We are less likely to serve out of guilt, exhaustion, or resentment, and more likely to serve out of joy and compassion. A heart that knows it is loved does not need to compete nor condemn. Instead, it can listen deeply, forgive freely, and give generously.

Jesus modeled this rhythm. He cared deeply for others, yet He also withdrew to pray, rest, and reconnect with the Father. Jesus honored His own humanity while fulfilling His divine mission. In doing so, Jesus showed us that caring for ourselves is not a distraction from loving others; it is part of it.

As a church community, may we encourage one another to embrace God's love personally and wholeheartedly. Let us remind each other that self-care rooted in faith is not weakness, but wisdom. When we see ourselves as God sees us; worthy, forgiven, and cherished; we become better equipped to love our neighbors with the same grace.

May we grow in love that begins within, flows outward, and reflects the boundless love of Christ.

**Senior Pastor:** Rev. Carolann Hopcke – Leaving on vacation Christmas Morning and will return on January 2<sup>nd</sup>. Michael Miller, Clock Repairman from York (402-710-3202), serviced the grandfather clock on Tuesday, December 16<sup>th</sup>. He did maintenance on the grandfather clock in the lounge at a cost of \$100. The clock hadn't been touched since 2015; it should be serviced every 5-7 years. Annual reports are due on January 5<sup>th</sup>. The council has coffee fellowship in January: 4<sup>th</sup> – Kay Flanagan & Mary Kay Tisthammer; 11<sup>th</sup> – Chris Nelson & Roberta Seda; 18<sup>th</sup> – Jim Meyer & Tammy Reigle; 25<sup>th</sup> – Josh Thayer & either Sara Rasmussen or Amanda Reinhart. There is one baptism scheduled in January and another to be scheduled soon.

**Intern Pastor:** Vicar Keith Powell – Classes ended on December 12<sup>th</sup>. He passed two classes for sure and is waiting to hear about the last class. J-term classes begin on January 6<sup>th</sup>; they're only four days a week and will end January 23<sup>rd</sup>. Vicar will attend Prolog at Wartburg Seminary February 2 – 6.

**High School Youth Coordinator:** Dorothy Grosch – They didn't sell a lot of pies for Thanksgiving. The candle light service was nice. They sold a lot of Christmas cookies.

### Committee Reports

**Evangelism:** The hospital bears and dogs arrived. The evangelism committee hosted free movies at Gateway Theater with over 80 people in attendance. The Albion Light Parade was on December 4<sup>th</sup>. Zion's float was Grinch themed and we had 13 kids participate with the float. The giveaways were Grinch themed. The committee is thinking about an alternate idea for May Day to the cookie plates given in the past. New Member gift bags have been given to folks as they join. The committee is thinking about a possible Easter Outreach with gift bags for the community.

**Faith and Fellowship:** 21 folks enjoyed the Holiday Dinner at the Albion Country Club on December 11<sup>th</sup>. Everyone was a winner at various Christmas trivia challenges.

**Fundraising Committee:** 227 calendars have been sold so far. There is discussion about a possible jigsaw puzzle competition. Initial thoughts include using 500-piece puzzles, cost of \$100 per team, and food would be provided by the Faith & Fellowship Committee. The hope is to do this at the Nest.

**Nominating Committee:** Chris Nelson, Josh Thayer, Mary Kay Tisthammer, Trina Hellbusch, Patti Meyer, Katie Rugg. They will need to meet soon to have nominees for the Annual Meeting.

**Parish Education:** The Christmas program went very well last Sunday. The parish education committee will be meeting again in January.

**Property & Maintenance:** There was a bat found above Pastor's door in November. The bat found in December was by the elevator. Vicar removed the bats. Josh is waiting to hear from Tyler Iverson about our heating and air conditioning units and thermostats. The thermostat by the sacristy is for AC only. The pulpit light doesn't show enough to be helpful. The sanctuary lightbulbs will be changed out soon. Tommy Heesacker will help Josh change the lights. The architect has been asked for the digitized plans for the church; he promised to email them to Josh Thayer. Thanks to the Property Committee for putting up the nativity scene. Now that the scene is complete, it can be put up sooner next year. The church needs to remove the griddle; we will ask if anyone would want it for a donation. If we can sell it, the money would go toward the elevator.

**Worship Committee:** The poinsettias will be here Wednesday. Confirmation and Luther League decorated the church. Pastor bought special candle lighters for the All Saints worship services.







## Mobile Food Pantry ~ Sat., February 7<sup>th</sup>

The next Mobile Food Pantry will be held on Saturday, February 7<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am at the Boone County Fairgrounds. This is set up as a drive-through only. All patrons will need to enter the fairgrounds from the 11<sup>th</sup> and Fairview entrance. Vehicles will be taken in order of arrival in a designated line. The first vehicle to arrive is asked to follow the road into the fairgrounds and stop and park directly in front of the cones that will be set out. All other vehicles entering that are there for the mobile pantry need to follow in line and wait until you have been asked to do otherwise.

If anyone is coming to volunteer their time, please park in the west parking lot next to the Casey Building. If you are willing and are able to volunteer, please arrive around 8:15 am.

If any volunteers or patrons have any symptoms of illness, please refrain from coming to the mobile pantry this month but feel free to ask someone else to pick up for you.

The Food Bank of the Heartland will provide pre-packaged boxes, along with some other produce and food products. Each patron will be required to take what is already packed in each box.

A specific number of vehicles at a time will be sent down to the distribution area. All people attending must remain in their vehicles unless asked to get out. All cars in the distribution area must remain parked until all of those vehicles are told to move. This is a big change as to how things are generally done so we ask for your patience and cooperation as the volunteers are doing their best.

Everyone is reminded that there is always the possibility that the mobile pantry could be cancelled or postponed due to the current events. Coordinators will do their best to update the information in the newspaper or through the Boone County Nebraska Sheriff's Facebook page.




## PRETZELS & LENT

Did you know that the easiest and perhaps most significant Lenten food custom for our time might be to serve a small pretzel to every member of the family with their main meal? It sounds surprising, but the pretzel has a deep spiritual meaning for Lent. In fact, it was the ancient Christian Lenten bread as far back as the fifth century. To remind themselves that Lent was a time of prayer, they shaped their breads in the form of arms crossed in prayer (in those days they crossed their arms over their hearts while praying). Therefore they called the breads "little arms" (braceletae). From the Latin word the Germans later coined the term, "pretzel."

Thus the pretzel is the most appropriate food symbol in Lent. It still shows the form of arms crossed in prayer, reminding us that Lent is a time of prayer. It consists only of water and flour (hard pretzels), thus proclaiming Lent as a time of fasting. Besides, its custom came down to us from the early Christians who had invented it as the bearer of such a great spiritual message. On the last Sunday before Lent, we will be sharing pretzels as a reminder of this ancient tradition and as a way to begin our preparation for the journey of Lent. Please join us on **Transfiguration Sunday, February 15<sup>th</sup>!**






