

Go in peace. Christ is with you. Thanks be to God.




You must travel right through each event in Jesus' life in the right order!










SILENT WITNESSES


Though we are dust, you shared our life and died for us the death that sets us free.

We oppress others, even though you have set us free again and again. We squander the abundant gifts of the earth.


Transform our lives and guide us again in the way of the cross. Amen.

Opening Litany


In many and various ways

"Praise him, you servants of the Lord! Honor him, you descendants of Jacob! Worship him, you people of Israel! The Interview The Shroud



Holy Gospel Mark 15:42-46a
The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 15th chapter.
Glory to you, O Lord.

⁴²When evening had come, and since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the sabbath, ⁴³Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. ⁴⁴Then Pilate wondered if he were already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he had been dead for some time. ⁴⁵When he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the body to Joseph. ⁴⁶Then Joseph bought a linen cloth, and taking down the body, wrapped it in the linen cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been hewn out of the rock. He then rolled a stone against the door of the tomb.

He does not neglect the poor or ignore their suffering; he does not turn away from them, but answers when they call for help."

⁷And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; and ⁸he will swallow up death forever.

Then the Lord GOD will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the LORD has spoken.

⁹It will be said on that day,

Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us.

This is the LORD for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

Second Lesson 1 Peter 3:8-15

A reading from First Peter.

⁸Finally, all of you, have unity of spirit, sympathy, love for one another, a tender heart, and a humble mind. ⁹Do not repay evil for evil or abuse for abuse; but, on the contrary, repay with a blessing. It is for this that you were called — that you might inherit a blessing.

¹⁰For

"Those who desire life and desire to see good days, let them keep their tongues from evil and their lips from speaking deceit;

11 let them turn away from evil and do good; let them seek peace and pursue it.

12 For the every of the Lord are on the rightness.

¹²For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer.

But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil."

Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good?

¹⁴But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you.
