



By your strong love, our sins are buried in the grave, and we are called to travel on with you, blameless and forgiven, children of the everlasting day.


Continue your strong love for us, we pray. Fashion us, according to your will, into the people you would have us be, faithful witnesses in all we say and do.



The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 27th chapter.

All the proud will bow down to him; every mortal will bow down before him.


Future generations will serve him; people will speak of the Lord to the next generation.

Second Lesson 1 Peter 2:4-9

A reading from First Peter.

⁴Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

⁶For it stands in scripture:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious;

and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

⁷To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," and

"A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.
