

The God, whose mercies are new to us every morning, has brought us by His grace to this new day, to this new Advent, and to this new Church Year.


In the confidence that we are sustained by His grace, we enter into this new church year.

Lord Jesus Christ, you are the Light of the World.


Teach us that walking in your light means

<sup>5</sup>O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD! The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.** 


# **Scripture Reading**

Living together in trust and hope, let us confess our faith...


We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.


We believe in the Holy Spirit,







All praise and glory are yours, Holy One of Israel, Word of God incarnate, Power of the Most High, one God, now and forever. **Amen.** 


# Lord's Prayer

For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


