that we are undeserving of heavenly treasure.


By our selfishness we have sinned against you and against others in thought, word and deed.

that you sent your only Son to pay the price for our sin and purchase for us the kingdom of heaven. Giver of all good gifts, thank you for making us your treasure.


- P God, who gives the gift of the greatest treasure, you are the ruler over all the earth and your kingdom will never end.






Proper Preface

on earth as it is in heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread;




