March 9, 2025 The First Sunday in Lent

- A Heal us from all ungodly apathy or indifference so that we can be passionate for your kingdom work. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**
- P Here other intercessions may be offered. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**
- A Jesus, heal us by means of your body and blood and place your healing hands on all our hurts. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.





Proper Preface

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done,


on earth as it is in heaven.
